

Webinar – Bezbjedan povratak na radna mjesta 21.07.2020.

Budući da je pandemija novog korona virusa COVID-19 ostavila ogroman trag na način života i životni standard ljudi širom svijeta, Udruženje zaštite na radu Crne Gore je, u saradnji sa Međunarodnom organizacijom rada, 21.jula 2020. godine, organizovalo webinar, kako bi partnerima iz regiona Zapadnog Balkana bile predstavljene raspoložive smjernice i alati za bezbjedan i zdrav povratak na radna mjesta.

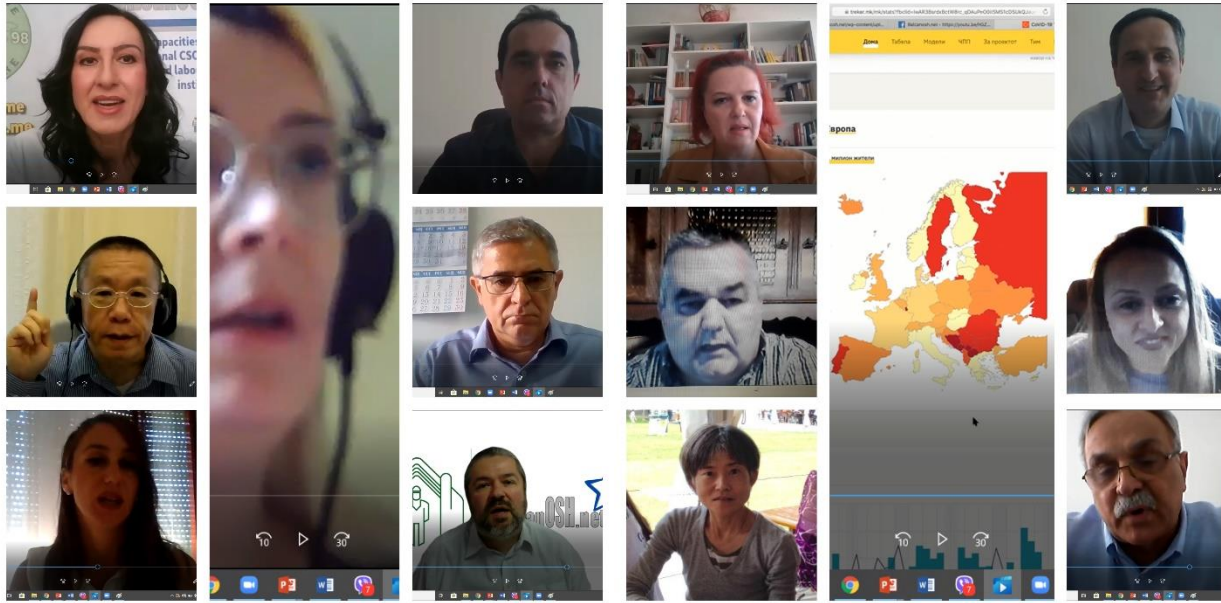
Sa partnerima iz Bosne i Hercegovine, Crne Gore, Sjeverne Makedonije i Srbije smo razgovarali o zajedničkim izazovima i koordinisanom pristupu zaštiti i zdravlju na radu uslijed pandemije, a u skladu sa principima i metodama MOR-a koji se odnose na zaštitu na radu i sprovođenje preventivnih mjera. Smjernice za bezbjedan povratak na posao, u deset akcionih koraka, s prisutnima je podijelila Dr Yuka Ujita iz MOR-a, a naglasila je i važnost procjene rizika od zaraze na svim radnim dužnostima, kao i načine mapiranja opasnosti.

Skrenuvši pažnju da uprkos mjerama za spriječavanje širenja pandemije koje su države uvele, ova zdravstvena kriza sve više prerasta u svjetsku ekonomsku krizu, uz razorne efekte po javno zdravlje i globalne ekonomske tokove, Kenichi Hirose iz MOR-a je podsjetio koliko je, baš u ovom trenutku, neophodna integracija mjera protiv COVID-19 u sisteme upravljanja zaštitom i zdravljem na radu.

U zemljama Zapadnog Balkana je poslednjih mjeseci potvrđeno da u svakoj vanrednoj situaciji pa i u ovoj, najveći izazov uvijek predstavlja ljudski faktor. Koliko dobro i brzo ćemo zaštititi sebe i druge, zavisi u jednakoj mjeri od onih koji treba da se pridržavaju mjera i onih koji o njima odlučuju. Shodno tome, kao veoma važna stvar pokazuje se procjena rizika koja je u ovoj epidemiji dobila još više na značaju i čega su valjda sada postali svjesni svi oni koji su procjenu rizika smatrali samo za formalnu, dodatnu i nametnutu zakonsku obavezu, a koja je sasvim suprotno tome, jedino sredstvo za upravljanje rizikom, što se pokazuje i u ovoj situaciji.

Koliko je u ovakvim uslovima moguće dosljedno sprovođenje mjera zaštite i zdravlja na radu i kako su na ove izazove odgovorili poslodavci, javne institucije, inspektori za zaštitu i zdravlje na radu, kao i stručnjaci iz ove oblasti, u zemljama Zapadnog Balkana govorili su: Vladislava Tadić iz Ministarstvo rada i boračko-invalidske zaštite iz Republike Srpske, Zlatko Popović - inspektor zaštite na radu za oblast zaštite i zdravlja na radu, iz Uprave za inspeksijske poslove Crne Gore, Maja Mijović - samostalna savejtnica Direkcije za zaštitu na radu CG, Zvezdana Oluić – Unija poslodavaca Crne Gore, Đina Janković – Udruženje zaštite na radu CG, Dragoslav Tomović – stručnjak za bezbednost na radu, Unija poslodavaca Srbije, Miodrag Lončević iz Uprave za bezbednost i zdravlje na radu u Republici Srbiji i Milan Petkovski – predsjednik Makedonskog udruženja za zaštitu i zdravlje na radu (MOSHA). 64 predstavnika svih zainteresovanih strana, iz čitavog regiona, prisustvovalo je ovom online skupu.

Organizovanjem ovog događaja Udruženje zaštite na radu i Međunarodna organizacija rada su napravile važan iskorak prema udruženjima i strukovnim organizacijama iz regiona i naglasile važnost zaštite i zdravlja na radu, posebno u aktuelnim uslovima izazvanim pandemijom.

Report – Webinar - Safe return to Work

July 21st 2020

Since the new pandemic of COVID-19 has left a huge mark on the way of life and living standard of people around the world, the Safety at Work Association of Montenegro, in cooperation with The International Labor Organization, organized a webinar on July 21st 2020, in order to provide our partners from the Western Balkans region with available guidelines and tools for a safe and healthy return to work.

We talked with our partners from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, Northern Macedonia and Serbia about the common challenges and the coordinated approach to occupational safety and health during the pandemic, in accordance with the principles and methods of ILO on safety at work and enforcement of preventive measures. The guidelines for a safe return to work, in ten action steps were shared with the participants by Dr. Yuka Ujita from ILO, where she addressed the importance of assessing the risk of infection in all working positions, as well as hazard mapping methods.

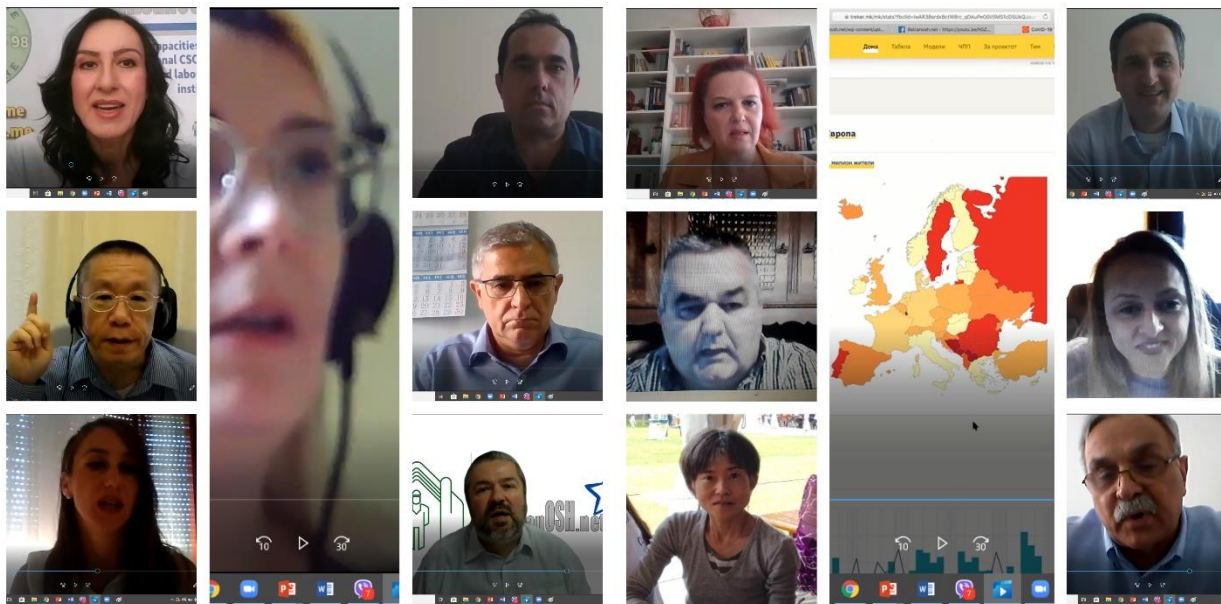
Drawing attention to the fact that, despite the measures to prevent the spread of the pandemic, the health crisis is increasingly turning into a global economic crisis, with devastating effects on public health and global economic trends, Kenichi Hirose from ILO reminded us how important it is to integrate the measures against COVID-19 into occupational health and safety management systems.

In the countries of the Western Balkans, it has been confirmed in the recent months that in every emergency situation, like this one, the biggest challenge is always the human factor. How well and quickly we will be able to protect ourselves and others, depends equally on those who should adhere to the measures and those who decide on them. Consequently, risk assessment has proved to be a very important matter, even more so during the pandemic. Even those who considered risk assessment only a formal, additional and imposed legal obligation, have now become aware that it is quite the opposite, and in fact the only means for risk management, which has been as proven in this situation, as well.

The participants spoke about the extent to which it is possible in such conditions to consistently implement measures of safety and health at work and how employers, public institutions, inspectors for safety and health at work, as well as experts in this field responded to the challenges, in the countries of the Western Balkans. Among the speakers were: Vladislava Tadic from the Ministry of Labor and Veteran Disability Protection from the Republic of Srpska, Zlatko Popovic – OSH Inspector, from the Directorate

for Inspection Affairs of Montenegro, Maja Mijovic - independent advisor of the Directorate for Occupational Safety of Montenegro, Zvezdana Oluic – Employers’ Union of Montenegro, Djina Jankovic – Safety at Work Association of Montenegro, Dragoslav Tomovic - OSH Expert from the Employers Union of Serbia, Miodrag Loncovic from the Directorate for Safety and Health at Work in the Republic of Serbia and Milan Petkovski - President of the Macedonian Occupational Safety and Health Association (MOSHA). 64 representatives of all stakeholders, from across the region, attended this online gathering.

By organizing this event, the Safety at Work Association and the International Labor Organization have made an important step towards strengthening the cooperation with associations and professional organizations from the region, and emphasized the importance of safety and health at work, especially in the current conditions caused by the pandemic.
